Philip Tells a Friend About Jesus

WHAT'S THE POINT?

Andrew told his brother Simon Peter about Jesus. The next day Jesus found Philip and asked him to follow Him. Philip recognized Jesus as the hope and promise the world had been waiting for, the coming Messiah. He was so excited! After Philip chose to follow Jesus, he quickly found his <u>friend</u> Nathanael and told him about Jesus. Nathanael doubted Philip's invitation initially, saying no good thing could certainly come out of Nazareth, but Philip insisted he come and see Jesus for himself.

Nathanael was surprised to find out Jesus already knew him. He turned from skeptism to belief and chose to follow Jesus. We need to help students move from any doubt or skeptism and also choose to follow Jesus. We want to help them be excited about what God has done in their life and want to share the same with their friends.

GET CONNECTED



Building relationships in surf teams; introducing today's lesson

Memory Link cards, Hang 10 pages, index cards, pens, highlighters

Use the following conversation prompts to get to know the students in your surf team and to introduce today's lesson.

- Our character word today is <u>friendliness</u>. Let's look at the definition in the front of our KBC Study Bibles. (Have a student read it aloud and discuss)
- What makes a good friend?
- How are you a friend to others?



Guide students to locate and mark today's Bible Connection and Memory Link in their Bibles, if they brought one, so they can find the pages quickly as directed in the session.

MEMORY LINK



2 Minutes - Teaching the Bible verse to students

8 Minutes - Activity to help them memorize the verse

Note cards, pen/marker

Focus on the Bible

Each week in Memory Link, count who remembered to bring their Bibles. Encourage students to hold up their Bibles high in the air while you count. Keep a running total and try to increase the number of Bibles brought every week. You might even consider a little competition between grade levels or boys vs. girls.

Focus on Today's Memory Link

Direct students to open their KBC Study Bibles to Matthew 28:19a (page 1069). Ask a volunteer to read the verse aloud as the students follow along.

Our character word today is friendliness. Our verse says to be a good friend and give preference to one another – that means letting a friend eat the last cookie! Or win a game, or go first in line, or choose their favorite color to paint. What are some other ways to be a good <u>friend</u>? (Accept all responses.)

Let's read our Memory Link together again.

Option 1 - READY, SET, GO!

Beach pail, wad of paper for each student

Prepare

Print each word of the verse on individual cards, including the Scripture address.

Place a set in a bag for each surf team. Set a time and see how fast each team can arrange the words of the verse in the correct order.

Option 2 - AROUND THE WORLD

No supplies needed

Give each surf team a blowup globe ball. Students pass the ball around the circle as they say a word in the verse, including the address.

Teaching today's Character Word through a gospel-centered Bible story

No supplies needed

Set the Stage



Being a friend is a big job! I'm sure all of you have some good friends. You are friends because you like some of the same things – like sports, food, games. You like hanging out with each other. Sometimes you may not always agree on everything, but you are still friends. Let's look at the definition of friendliness in the front of our KBC Study Bible. Would a volunteer read it out loud to us?

Friendliness - Knowing, liking, and accepting other people just the way they are.

Today we will learn about two friends named Philip and Nathanael. Turn in your KBC Study Bible to page 1149. We are in the New Testament in the book of John. We will begin reading at verse 43.

Tell the Story

Jesus traveled to Galilee. There He found a man named Philip who lived in Galilee. Jesus walked up to Philip and said, "Follow Me". Now Philip knew who Jesus was because his friends Andrew and Peter had told him. He guickly turned to his friend, Nathanael and told him about Jesus. Philip explained to Nathanael that this is the one Moses and other prophets wrote - Jesus of Nazareth.

Nathanael was just a little confused because he asked, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" For you see, Nazareth was just a small little village. Most of the people who lived there were farmers and not very wealthy. Yet Philip is telling him about a man named Jesus - written about by prophets - and he was from a little place called Nazareth? He must have shook his head in disbelief!

But Philip said, "Come and see." When they got closer to Jesus, He spoke to Nathanael. Confused, Nathanael asked Jesus, "How do you know me?" (Read verses 48-50 for Jesus' response to Nathanael.)

What a cool thing for a friend to do for another! Philip introduced his friend, Nathanael to Jesus! And Nathanael followed Jesus, too!

Some of you have probably invited a friend to come to Beach Club® so that they (just like you) can hear about Jesus and how much He loves us. We can show friendliness in many ways, but the best way is to lead your friends to Jesus! Philip introduced Nathanael to Jesus. How can you introduce Jesus to your friends? (Accept all answers.)

Application

Some of you may have been introduced to Jesus at your church or by your parents or even a friends. Having Jesus as your Forever Friend is gaining a friend who will never ever leave you. He will be by your side FOREVER!

Teaching Tip

Students should be hands on with their Bibles and encouraged to follow along as the story is told. As you teach, allow time for all students to find verses and catch up to where you may be reading from the Bible. Encourage students to share their KBC Bible with a friend who may have forgotten theirs.

Gospel Connection

We know that sometimes we are not at our best. We do wrong things – that is called sin. Jesus wants us to ADMIT that we have sinned and ASK Him to forgive us of our sin. He also wants us to BELIEVE that He came to this earth and showed us how to live without sin. He died on the cross for our sins but rose to live in heaven with God. Then we can CHOOSE to follow Him – and to make Jesus your Forever Friend!

If that is something you want to talk with your Surf Team Leader or one of the other adults here today, you may go now to talk with someone.

<u>Friendship</u> is a priceless gift that Jesus wants us to share! Be a true <u>friend</u> and share Jesus this week!

Invite students wanting to know more about praying to ask Jesus to be their Forever Friend to move to the designated counseling area to talk with a leader one on one. Be sure to have all the decision supplies available.

Today's Bible Lesson

Use the Bible

Give each student a Memory Link card. Review today's Memory Link and Character Word. Guide them to use cards to mark today's story in their KBC Study Bibles, if they brought one, and lead them to highlight today's Memory Link verse.

Hang 10 Pages 📖

Give each student a Hang 10 page. Challenge kids to hang out with God 10 minutes each day by praying and reading the Bible, using the Hang 10 page as a guide. Encourage kids to do the Weekly Challenge and bring back their Hang 10 pages next week for a time of discussion.

Our Weekly Challenge is to be intentional and tell our <u>friends</u> about Jesus. Friends invite friends to come to Jesus!

Pray

Give the students a few minutes to share their prayer requests or write them on index cards. Ask a volunteer to lead the surf team in prayer. Take the cards home and remember to pray for the students in your surf team this week.

Dear God, help me be a good <u>friend</u> and tell others about You. In Jesus' name, amen.

Playing a game to review today's Bible Connection and Character Word

Option 1 - BALLOON RELAY

Painter's tape, balloons

Prepare

Mark a start line and finish line using painter's tape. Inflate at least one balloon for each surf team.

Explain that kids will move balloons from the start line to the finish line in a variety of ways. The first team to get their balloon across the finish line will have an opportunity to answer a review question. Instruct surf teams to line up behind the start line and begin races.


Option 2 - PENGUIN WADDLE

Plastic cone, beanbag

Instruct surf teams to line up single file. Place a cone several feet away from each team. The first player in each line will answer a review question, place a beanbag on top of each foot, and shuffle to the cone and back without dropping the beanbags off their feet. The first surf team to complete the relay wins.
